#### **A Serious Man**

*A Serious Man* is a 2009 black comedy film written, produced, and directed by Joel and Ethan Coen. The film stars Michael Stuhlbarg, Sari Lennick, Fred Melamed, and Richard Kind and tells the story of an ordinary man who is trying to find balance and understanding in the world, loosely based on the story of Job. The film has attracted a highly positive critical response, including a Golden Globe nomination for Stuhlbarg, a place on both the American Film Institute's and National Board of Review's Top 10 Film Lists of 2009, and a nomination for Academy Award for Best Picture.

### Thursday, February 25

#### **Taking Woodstock**

*Taking Woodstock* is a 2009 American comedy-drama film about the Woodstock Festival of 1969, directed by Ang Lee. The screenplay by James Schamus is based on the memoir Taking Woodstock: A True Story of a Riot, a Concert, and a Life by Elliot Tiber and Tom Monte. The film premiered at the 2009 Cannes Film Festival, and opened in New York and Los Angeles on August 26, 2009, before its wide theatrical release two days later.

#### **Antichrist**

*Antichrist* is a 2009 horror film written and directed by Lars von Trier, about a couple who, after the death of their child, retreat to a cabin in the woods where their growing insanity becomes manifest in strange visions and increasingly violent sexual behavior. The film stars only two actors, Charlotte Gainsbourg and Willem Dafoe. The narrative is made up of a prologue, four chapters and an epilogue. Primarily a Danish production, the film was also co-produced with companies from five other countries. After premiering at the 2009 Cannes Film Festival, where Gainsbourg won the festival's award for Best Actress, the film came under attack for what some critics view as misogyny, as well as for featuring explicit sexual violence. At the same time many critics praised the film for its visuals and serious approach. Other awards include the Robert Award for best Danish film, The Nordic Council Film Prize for best Nordic film and the European Film Award for best cinematography.

### Friday, February 26

## **Lebanon**

**Lebanon** is an Israeli war film directed by Samuel Maoz. It won the Leone d'Oro at the 66th Venice International Film Festival, becoming the first Israeli-produced film to have won that honour. The film has not yet had a wide release. In Israel itself the film has invited controversy. The film was nominated for 10 Ophir Awards, including Best Film.

## **Away we go**

**Away We Go** is a 2009 comedy-drama directed by Academy Award-winning director Sam Mendes and written by the husband-and-wife team of Dave Eggers and Vendela Vida. The film stars John Krasinski, Maya Rudolph, Allison Janney, Catherine O'Hara, Jeff Daniels, Paul Schneider, Carmen Ejogo, Chris Messina, Melanie Lynskey, Josh Hamilton, Jim Gaffigan, and Maggie Gyllenhaal. It was released in limited in the United States starting June 5, 2009. It opened the 2009 Edinburgh International Film Festival in Edinburgh, Scotland. The film was released on DVD and Blu-Ray on September 29, 2009.

## **Saturday, February 27**

### **Looking for Eric**

**Looking for Eric** is a British film about the escape from the trials of modern life that football and its heroes can bring for its fans. It was written by screen writer Paul Laverty and directed by English director Ken Loach. The film's cast includes former professional footballer Eric Cantona and former bassist with The Fall, Steve Evets. Director Ken Loach said of the film, "We wanted to deflate the idea of celebrities as more than human. And we wanted to make a film that was enjoying the idea of what you and I would call solidarity, but what others would call support for your friends really, and the old idea that we are stronger as a team than we are as individuals."

### **Everybody's Fine**

**Everybody's Fine** is a remake of the Giuseppe Tornatore film Stanno Tutti Bene that is written and directed by Kirk Jones and stars Robert De Niro, Drew Barrymore, Sam Rockwell and Kate Beckinsale. The film opened on December 4, 2009.

## **Sunday , February 28**

### **Ghost Writer**

**The Ghost Writer** is an upcoming film adaption of the Robert Harris novel The Ghost. The film is directed by Roman Polanski and based on a screenplay written by Harris and Polanski. It stars Ewan McGregor and Pierce Brosnan. On his way to the Zurich Film Festival, Polanski was arrested by Swiss police in September 2009. Due to Polanski's arrest, post-production was briefly put on hold, but he resumed work from house arrest at his Swiss villa.

## **Un Prophete**

*A Prophet* (French: *Un prophète*) is a 2009 French crime film directed by Jacques Audiard. Audiard claims that the film aims at "creating icons, images for people who don't have images, the Arabs in France," though he also had stated that the film "has nothing to do with his vision of society," and is a work of fiction.

## **Monday , March 1**

### **Fish Tank**

*Fish Tank* is a 2009 British drama film directed by Andrea Arnold. The film won the Jury Prize at the 62nd Cannes Film Festival. It was filmed in and around Essex, England, and funded by BBC Films and the UK Film Council.

### **Bad Lieutenant - port of call New Orleans**

*Bad Lieutenant: Port of Call: New Orleans* is a 2009 American crime drama film directed by Werner Herzog and starring Nicolas Cage. Filming began in July 2008 in Louisiana, and also around South Mississippi, shooting some scenes at the Hollywood Casino in Bay St. Louis. The film was released on November 20, 2009. It draws superficially from Abel Ferrara's 1992 film, *Bad Lieutenant*, which featured a crooked cop (Harvey Keitel), who is a drug addict and takes sexual favors as bribes. The film's director insists that it is not a sequel or a remake.

## **Tuesday, March 2**

### **Men who stare at goats**

*The Men Who Stare at Goats* is a 2009 comedy film directed by Grant Heslov and written by Peter Straughan and released in theaters on November 6, 2009. It is based on the book of the same title by author Jon Ronson, an account of the investigation by Ronson and John Sergeant into attempts by US military forces to use psychic powers.

### **Shutter Island**

*Shutter Island* is an upcoming 2010 thriller film directed by Martin Scorsese and starring Leonardo DiCaprio. The film is based on the 2003 novel of the same name by Dennis Lehane. Production started in March 2008. *Shutter Island* was originally slated to be released on October 2, 2009, but Paramount pushed the release date to February 19, 2010. Paramount head executive Brad Grey blamed the recent economic downturn as the main decision behind the delayed release date.
